# EDF MVP Selection Process

# a. Introduction

Most Valuable Player (MVP) awards are mandatory at all European Championship events. For regional tournaments (NEC, CEC, WEC, EEC) and Junior events (JEC), however, presenting an MVP award is optional and left to the discretion of the host.

## b. Goal

With MVP awards EDF also aims to highlight individual achievements alongside team performances.

# c. MVP categories

All categories must have their own MVPs.

For the European Championships, a total of eight (8) MVPs must be selected - four for each ball type (Cloth and Foam):

#### CLOTH:

- Best Player in the Men's category
- Best Player in the Women's category
- Best Female Player in the Mixed category
- Best Male Player in the Mixed category

# FOAM:

- Best Player in the Men's category
- Best Player in the Women's category
- Best Female Player in the Mixed category
- Best Male Player in the Mixed category

## d. MVP selection

The selection of MVPs is limited to the finals of each category ("Finals MVP"). Only players who participated in the final match are eligible, meaning the MVP must be chosen from either the winning team or the runner-up.

The MVP will be selected by an expert panel appointed by the EDF Competition Department ahead of the tournament's final day. The panel must consist of 3 to 5 members who are able to watch the final without holding any official role in it (such as player, coach, or referee). Typically, commentators and members of the tournament's organizing team are invited to join the panel.

# e. MVP awards

The choice of award - be it a trophy, certificate, or another form - is left to the discretion of the host. However, a physical award must be presented.
